

What does the future hold for Albury? Have your Say!

Many changes have taken place in Albury during recent decades. Some residents will remember local shops, a school, Weston Wood (before the landfill) and a lot less traffic. In recent years new housing has been developed and many small businesses have moved into the Parish. Some clubs and associations have strengthened, like the Produce Association and the Cricket & Football Clubs, but others now struggle. Campaigns have been successfully fought to keep the village post office and prevent on-shore gas storage, and the landfill, having been a blot on the landscape for more than 20 years, is now thankfully moving into a restoration phase.



Some time ago the Parish Council facilitated the formation of an independent Parish Plan Committee. A Parish Plan is a process that engages the people who live in our Parish in a debate about our local area, in order to improve the longer-term well-being of our community. The government is committed to giving more power to local communities so that we can control our destiny, and the Localism Bill that was passed in November 2011 is an important step in implementing this policy.

The Parish Plan Committee ("PPC") is chaired by William Moorwood who lives in Farley Green. It is a self-appointed committee of volunteers from our community; it has the full support of the Parish Council, but most importantly, in our view, it is independent of the Parish



Council. Its objective is to facilitate the development of the Parish Plan through a process that will ensure the views of the community are properly represented.

So far the PPC has identified stakeholders in the Parish such as clubs, societies, organisations and businesses. It has held a number of meetings with representatives of these stakeholders to identify local needs.

It is important that the process of producing a Parish Plan involves a high degree of consultation and debate so that everyone has an opportunity to have their say and influence the outcome.

Enclosed with this edition is a separate letter from William Moorwood, summarising the process that is being followed to produce the Parish Plan, as well as the progress that has been made so far, and details of how you can get involved to shape the destiny of our Parish.

Please read William's letter, and have your say in the future for Albury.

Albury's Finances

The Parish Council spends a considerable amount of time each autumn considering the budget for the coming year, where the money is going to come from, and, in particular, how much should be asked from the Borough Council in the form of precept. A number of meetings are held and then the budget is finally agreed at our December meeting and submitted to the Borough Council. As you probably know, the precept is the money given by the Borough Council to the Parish Council to run our affairs, and is raised through your council tax.

The Parish Council is responsible, among other things, for the upkeep of Farley Green and the Recreation Ground, the lease, upkeep and day to day running of the Village Hall and Library, the care and maintenance of all the bus stops in the village, clearing of footpaths, cutting back of hedges, and special projects — for which we apply for help through grants — such as the litter bins on the heath, the new bus stop at Boundary Cottages, the re-surfacing of the village hall car park and refurbishment of the hall, and replacing a lot of unsightly metal road edging with oak post and rails.

You probably know that the Village Hall runs at a loss, but a great deal of work on behalf of the Parish Council has ensured that this loss has been drastically cut over the last two years, from over £8,000 to around £4,000 deficit per annum.

We have been pleased to see an increase in bookings, both through advertising and through the enhanced facilities, but still have a long way to go before the hall supports itself. In the past, the loss on the hall was supported by drawing on Parish Council reserves, but this is no longer possible.

The coming year will be a very busy one for the Parish Council, with a number of projects on the go. We are pleased to be supporting the Parish Plan Committee, as well as the plans for the Jubilee celebrations, but it is the everyday running of the Council's responsibilities that are our main focus. We expect to support and enhance the services provided by Borough and County, as they struggle to find the resources to do so, and to continue to improve the services that we ourselves offer at a local level.

As a result, the Parish Council has decided on a precept request of £38,515, an increase of 6% on last year. This equates to £62.56 per annum on a 'Band D' property, or £1.20 per week. We hope that you will consider this to be money well spent, and look forward to seeing you at future Parish Council meetings, where you can find out more about how decisions are made and where priorities lie. What next for your Parish Council.....?

As you know Albury is defined as a 'Quality Council' which is the result of the qualification by our Parish Clerk. Now it is the individual Councillors turn!

In 2007 the Government initiated a programme called "The Power of Well-Being" which enables the council to "do anything which it considers likely to achieve the promotion or improvement of the economic, social, or environmental well-being of their area".

This means that with the new "Localism Bill" a lot of power will be devolved locally. With the communities backing, the Parish Council will be able to spend, provide lending, give financial assistance, set up contracts, companies & joint ventures. In effect, do most things that an individual can do.

To obtain the **Power of Well-Being**, each councillor is required to be trained. The final training session for Albury will be taking place on 9 February and this new status will be formally adopted at a 'Special' Parish Council Meeting on that day.

Audacious Thieves About

Environment Agency Update On Operations at the Albury Landfill - December 2011

Since the last round of information the gas flare compound has been SITA's secured and Contractors have been pushing ahead with the construction of the leachate treatment plant.



capping operation along the village side of the site together with Cell B on the northern side of the site has now finished for the winter and will resume in 2-3 months time, however, SITA will be continuing to fill the remaining void and bringing in top soils to continue with their proposed restoration.

For Albury.....?

 ${f T}$ he Department for Environment, Farming and Rural Affairs (DEFRA) has recently announced a £20 million national fund to support the improvement of broadband in rural areas. Individual communities will be able to bid for funding, and applications will need to be aligned with their local authority's Local Broadband Plan.

Surrey County Council wants to ensure that homes and businesses in Surrey are able to access superfast broadband, no matter where they are located in the county. This work is now well underway and they are in dialogue with three strong bidders to develop the best technological solution to deliver Surrey's ambition.

To cover all of the different communities within Surrey there will be a number of technical problems that will have to be overcome. The final solution may well be a mix of Fibre, Wireless and finally Satellite technologies.

Whatever the solution looks like, all of these technologies should deliver an open access network that will enable homes and businesses in Surrey to subscribe to Superfast Broadband via a choice of different internet service providers and packages.
